# **Application for Tertiary Student Concession Card**

(For Freshmen joining NAFA in Academic Year 2017/18)



NAFA full-time diploma / degree students may apply for a Tertiary Student Concession Card which allows the cardholder to purchase Bus / Train / Hybrid Monthly Concession Passes.

### **How to Apply**

- Application period is from 1 July 2017 to 31 August 2017.
- The Concession Card can only be used from the start date of the course, i.e. 31 July 2017 onwards.

#### Note:

Students who had applied for admission to more than one tertiary institution should apply for the Concession Card only after you have confirmed your choice of institution. Your Concession Card application will be rejected if you have more than one record in the TransitLink database.

Application is not compulsory. Students can decide whether there is a need to purchase the Concession Card.

 a) Singaporeans and Singapore Permanent Residents may apply for the Concession Card, approximately 3 weeks after you have paid your first semester course fee at NAFA or from 1 July 2017 onwards, whichever is later (see application period above).

International students are to apply for the Concession Card <u>after</u> obtaining the ICA Student's Pass and payment of the first semester course fees.

- b) You should check your eligibility for application (using your NRIC or FIN) at the TransitLink website: <a href="https://www.transitlink.com.sg">www.transitlink.com.sg</a>.

- c) Those who are eligible may proceed to submit your application during the application period via one of the following means:
  - Walk-in to any of the TransitLink Ticket Office (TLTO)
    - Bring along original NRIC / Passport / ICA Student's Pass
    - Payment of \$5 non-refundable card cost and \$3 non-refundable personalization fee
  - Online application via TransitLink website at <a href="http://www.transitlink.com.sg">http://www.transitlink.com.sg</a>
  - Mobile application via Transitlink Mobile Services App
    - Step by step instructions on application will be provided
    - Payment of \$5 non-refundable card cost and \$3 non-refundable personalization fee via eNETS
- d) Please keep / print the receipt as proof of payment.
- e) TransitLink will send your Concession Card to NAFA and we will distribute the card to you during Orientation. You may approach the Office of Student Affairs (NAFA Campus 1, Level 2) at the start of the semester if you do not receive your Concession Card in time during Orientation.
- f) Once you have received your Concession Card, you have to pay a minimum top up of \$10 at any TLTO to activate the card for use.
