

## **Pre-Course Counselling Checklist (Foundation)**

- This pre-course counselling provides guidance and advice on the suitability of the programmes to the aspirations of applicants. Please refer to the programme information (https://www.nafa.edu.sg/schools-and-programmes) to find out more before applying.
- NAFA offers NAFA Foundation Programme (NFP) with a duration of 35 weeks. Applicants
  offered a place in the NFP are given a conditional offer of admission to their selected
  diploma programme, subject to meeting the portfolio, admission test or audition
  requirement. Their admission is confirmed when they complete the NFP successfully.

The NAFA Diploma Programmes have a duration of 3 years. However, under exceptional circumstances, students are allowed up to 5 years to complete the programme.

- NFP and Diploma programmes offered by NAFA are funded by Singapore's Ministry of Education (MOE) and exempted from the Fee Protection Scheme under the Edutrust requirements of the SkillsFuture Singapore (SSG).
- Admission requirements include:
  - o Potential in Artistic Talent and Creativity (Admission Test/Audition/Portfolio Submission)
  - o English Language Proficiency
  - Educational Qualifications (Applicants who score 4 and above in English Language will be required to attend an interview.)
- The application results will be released 4 6 weeks after the Admission Test/Audition/Portfolio Submission.
- The Academic Calendar starts from March each year to February of the following year.

- The **Tuition Grant Scheme (TGS)** was introduced by the Government to help students with the cost of tertiary education in Singapore.
  - Eligible Singapore Citizens are automatically awarded a Tier A Tuition Grant, which is the highest level of tuition fee subsidy, Singapore Citizens thus pay the lowest tuition fees. There is no bond obligation.
  - Eligible **Singapore Permanent Residents** (SPRs) may choose to apply for a Tier B Tuition Grant only. Successful applicants are required to work for a Singapore entity for three years upon graduation.
  - Eligible international students may choose to apply for a Tier C Tuition Grant only. There is a limited number of Tuition Grants available for international students, and selection is competitive and based on merit. Successful applicants are required to work for a Singapore entity for three years upon graduation.
  - The Tuition Grant is not transferable between programmes. The applicant may be required to take another Admission Test, Audition or Portfolio Submission if he/she would like to apply for another programme.
  - Applicants who have exceeded the maximum TGS cap of 10 semesters or graduates from the local polytechnics (SP, NP, NYP, TP or RP), universities (NUS, NTU, SMU, SIT, SUSS and SUTD) or LASALLE College of the Arts, are no longer entitled to the Tuition Grant and will have to pay the full programme fees for their study at the Academy.

## • Student's Pass (STP)

- The Immigration and Checkpoints Authority (ICA) is the primary authority that controls immigration matters.
- o Part-Time work of up to a maximum of 16 hours per week is permitted

- Terms and Conditions are issued by the ICA for the STP

- NAFA does not run any hostels and applicants are required to arrange **accommodation** and make provisions on the cost of living independently.
