FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

• Student's Pass (STP)

- The Immigration and Checkpoints Authority (ICA) is the primary authority that controls immigration matters.
- To apply for a Student's Pass, international applicants must enroll into an approved full-time programme in Singapore. ICA does not issue STP for part-time programmes.
- Part-Time work of up to a maximum of 16 hours per week is permitted

- o Terms and Conditions are issued by the ICA for the STP

- NAFA does not run any hostels and applicants are required to arrange **accommodation** and make provisions on the cost of living independently.
