develop conceptual and critical consciousness

The Bachelor of Arts (Honours) Fine Art course, validated by the world-renowned University of the Arts London (UAL), is a three-year course that will prepare students with the knowledge and skills required to lead the local and regional arts scene as a holistic, reflective and engaged art practitioner.





The course aims to develop the students' ability to work collaboratively and independently around transdisciplinary and collective art practices that are supported by industry partnerships and projects. BA (Hons) Fine Art explores cultural research, distinctively informed by the NAFA spirit of adventure, exploration, and resilience.



Students will be immersed in a studio environment that supports creative experimentations across varied techniques that are essential to a Fine Art practice, from traditional mediums to contemporary approaches. Students will engage themselves in the UK as part of the international placement at UAL, and hold an Internship or Residency placement in their second year.


Practice-Led and Industry-Focused Curriculum

The UAL-NAFA Partnership

The UAL-NAFA partnership is the first for the University of Arts London, ranked first in art and design undergraduate programmes according to the 2022 QS World University Rankings. It is Europe's largest specialist art and design university, with over 19,000 students from more than 130 countries. This partnership marks the first time that the University is offering validated programmes outside the UK.

International Placement at UAL

The proposed course will offer students the opportunity to spend seven weeks on an international placement in London. Students will benefit from the immersion in a lively cultural capital with opportunities to experience diverse art practices. They will experience classes and workshops co-taught by faculty from both institutions, stimulating multi-cultural integration and collaboration.

Examination of issues from different disciplinary perspectives and the opportunity to challenge as well as integrate ideas and skills into original and cohesive responses.

Central Location within Singapore's Arts and Heritage District

The NAFA campus is located in the city centre and within close proximity and walking distance to the Singapore Art Museum, Objectifs - Centre for Photography and Film, Centre 42, various art institutions, museums and galleries. This vibrant district is a catalyst for discourse, dialogue, teaching and learning of the arts.

admission requirements

The standard minimum entry requirements for this course are one or a combination of the following qualifications:

ENTRY INTO FIRST YEAR (either one of the following):



International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma



Singapore-Cambridge A-Level (Minimum 2 A-Level/H2 subjects and a pass in General Paper)



Polytechnic Diploma (Singapore)



Equivalent of Year 12 qualifications

DIRECT ENTRY INTO SECOND YEAR:



A relevant Diploma in Fine Art from NAFA or a recognised institution

» Diploma transcript must indicate passing grades in equivalent NAFA diploma modules

Submit a portfolio which consists of 5 best examples of your creative works. Each of these works should be supported by up to 3 visuals of development works.

Submit a Statement of Intent of about 500 words outlining the applicant's interest(s) of practice and/or work the applicant aims to produce in the course of study.

Applicants should be 18 years of age or older in the year of admission to Year 1.

English language requirements:

All classes are taught in English. If English was not the applicant's primary medium of instruction throughout his or her school education, the applicant must provide evidence at enrolment of the following: IELTS level 6.0 or above, with at least 5.5 in reading, writing, listening, and speaking. ACCREDITATION OF PRIOR (EXPERIENTIAL) LEARNING

Applicants who do not meet these course entry requirements may still be considered in exceptional cases.


