The Bachelor of Arts (Honours) Design Practice course, validated by the world-renowned University of the Arts London (UAL) is a three-year course that will propel your career in the design industry.

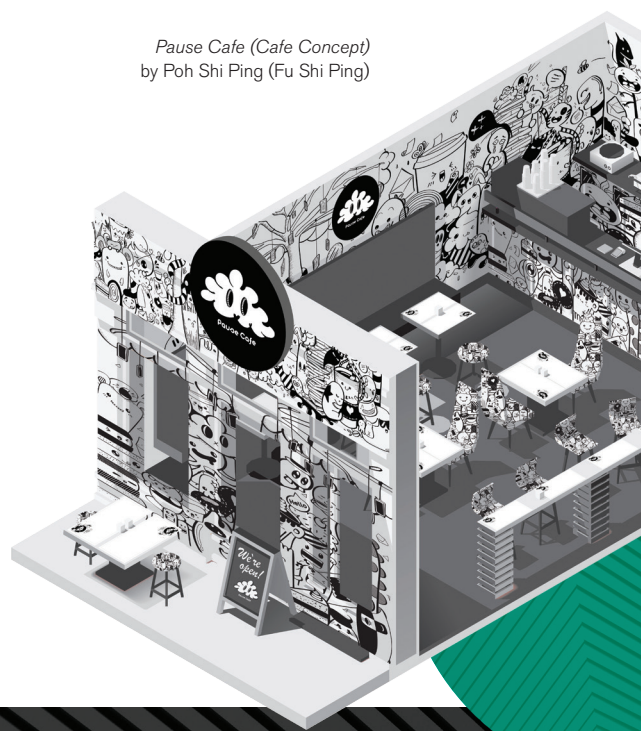


Develop mastery in your technical competencies in one of the four design domains (3-Dimensional, Communication, Fashion, and Spatial). You will also broaden your multidisciplinary perspectives, and a robust set of transferable skills necessary to navigate the design landscape of today.

Attending lessons as one cohort, you will collaborate across domains where you will engage in research-based studios. You will also spend seven weeks in the UK as part of the international placement at UAL.

Grounded on a practice-led and industry-based learning pedagogy, you will work on client projects and also gain exposure through a 10-week internship in your final year.

distinctive features

Practice-Led and Industry-Focused Curriculum

Students will experience live client projects or internship as part of the course requirement. Such work experience aims to deepen students' skillsets through industry application and attaining mastery by integrating theory with practice. Modules such as Design Studio and Design Futures and Insights, will enable students to develop skill sets that relate to their design toolkits while responding to real-world challenges in creative manners.

Understanding Current Issues and Future Trends

The reading of cultural issues with emergent political, economic, social, technological, legal environmental contexts will be woven into the curriculum as students study the impact of design with its integration in the community. Students will apply design thinking to explore interventions, test ideas, and assess their design impact.

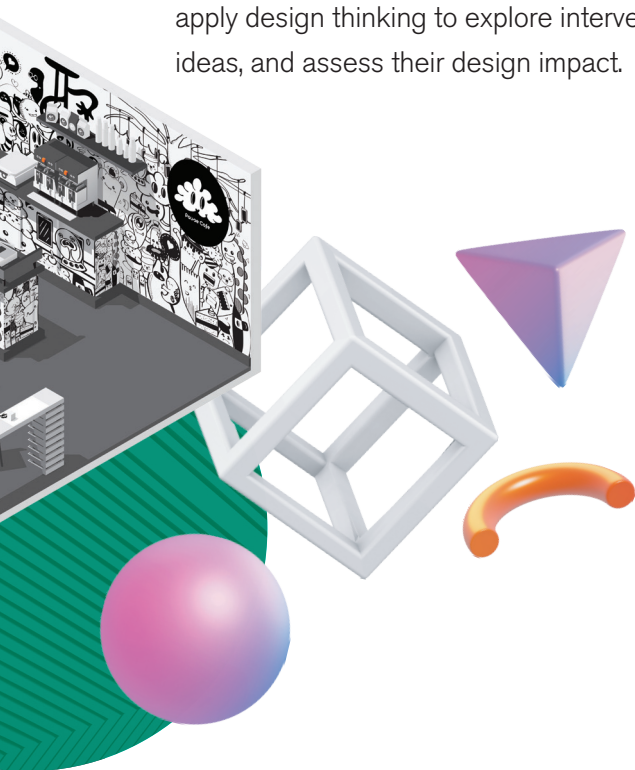
The UAL-NAFA Partnership

The UAL-NAFA partnership is the first for the University of Arts London, ranked first in art and design undergraduate programmes according to the 2021 QS World University Rankings. It is Europe's largest specialist art and design university, with over 19,000 students from more than 130 countries. This partnership marks the first time that the University is offering validated programmes outside the UK.



International Placement at UAL

The course offers students the opportunity to spend seven weeks on an international placement in London, studying with international practitioners and experts in their fields. Students will benefit from the immersion in a lively cultural capital with opportunities to experience design from fresh perspectives. The studio modules will be conducted by faculty from London over this period, adding to the multicultural integration and collaboration.





The NAFA Spirit and the Southeast Asian Arts Dimension

The course will have a strong Southeast Asian arts focus to drive research inquiries, raising critical discourse while opening new perspectives that will broaden and contribute to practices and cultural research around the region. A Southeast Asian masterclass kickstarts the beginning of every semester that serves as stimulus to the learning journey, with aspects of cultural heritage incorporated into the course.

Live-Client Project/ Internship

All students will have the opportunity to undertake a live-client project/internship in the final year for a period of 10 weeks that will provide students with insights and knowledge of professional practice, that enable their alignment of skills and capabilities to the real needs of the industry.

Interdisciplinary and Transdisciplinary Learning

Students will be equipped with skills from their chosen domain and progress to explore interdisciplinary opportunities, learning to see design as a synergetic fusion of different perspectives. A student-led transdisciplinary project will be undertaken in the final semester of the course.

Central Location within Singapore's Arts and Heritage District

NAFA is located within the Bugis Arts Belt in the city centre, within walking proximity to the National Design Centre, museums, galleries, and arts groups, where a vibrant surrounding environment serves as active catalyst for engaging discourse, dialogue, teaching and learning of the arts.

admission requirements

The standard minimum entry requirements for this course are one or a combination of the following qualifications:

ENTRY INTO FIRST YEAR

(either one of the following):



International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma



Singapore-Cambridge A-Level (Minimum 2 A-Level/H2 subjects and a pass in General Paper)



Polytechnic Diploma (Singapore)



Equivalent of Year 12 qualifications

DIRECT ENTRY INTO SECOND YEAR:



A relevant diploma in design from NAFA or a recognised institution

» **Diploma transcript must indicate passing grades in equivalent NAFA diploma modules**

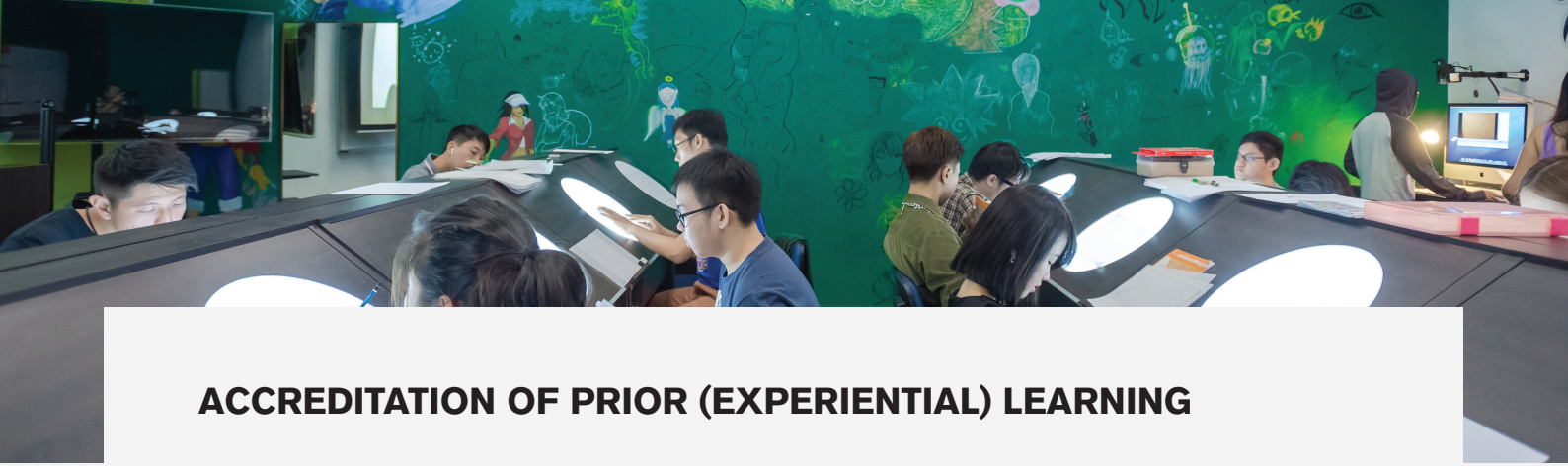
Submit a portfolio which consists of 10-15 pieces of the applicant's best works. These works should demonstrate creativity, passion, and curiosity and are a reflection of the applicant's view of the world.

Submit a Statement of Intent to communicate your purpose of pursuing a Design Practice degree course (250 to 300 words).

Applicants should be 18 years of age or older in the year of admission to Year 1.

English language requirements:

All classes are taught in English. If English was not the applicant's primary medium of instruction throughout his or her school education, the applicant must provide evidence at enrolment of the following: IELTS level 6.0 or above, with at least 5.5 in reading, writing, listening, and speaking. ACCREDITATION OF PRIOR (EXPERIENTIAL) LEARNING

Applicants who do not meet these course entry requirements may still be considered in exceptional cases.

The course team will consider each application that demonstrates additional strengths and alternative evidence. This might, for example, be demonstrated by:
