

FLORAL EMBROIDERY (4 SESSIONS X 3 HOURS)

This course aims to introduce basic embroidery techniques in the form of floral and botanical patterns. It is suitable for anyone with or without sewing experience. Through hands-on practice and live demonstrations, learners will learn 10 to 15 types of embroidery techniques. A canvas bag is used as the base for the embroidery designs, and the learners can take it home with them after the course.



Learning Outcomes:

At the end of this course, learners will be able to:

- Demonstrate basic embroidery techniques that serve as a foundation for their future embroidery projects.
- Engage the slow art of embroidery to enhance their mental well-being.
